

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


Hi there! My name is Harry and I'm the High Court of Australia Emu, and I've made lots of activities to help you learn about the Court.

The High Court of Australia is the highest court in the Australian judicial system. Its role is:

- to interpret and apply the law of Australia
- to decide cases of special significance to governments in Australia, and
- to hear appeals from federal, state and territory courts, after the High Court has permitted the appeal to be argued before it.





The activities in the pages that follow will help you to learn more about Australia's judicial system and the High Court.

So grab a pen and let's get hopping!







A judicial officer of the High Court of Australia appointed by the Governor General on the recommendation of the Federal Executive Council

A party defending an appeal to a higher court

Person who calls the public gallery of the High Court to order and announces the start of each sitting of the Court

Person who does administrative duties and takes notes during a High Court hearing

A party taking an appeal to a higher court


Attorney-General of the Commonwealth or a state or territory who is permitted to intervene in proceedings before the High Court that relates to a constitutional law matter

A qualified lawyer who specialises in arguing cases in court and who is 'retained' by a solicitor on behalf of the solicitor's client

An employee of the High Court who takes members of the public, including school groups, on tours of the Court building

Any bench comprising two or more Justices of the High Court




